AUCTIONS EXPLAINED

An auction usually involves selling items to people through 'bidding'.

This is where offers (bids) are taken from the crowd (or from people on phones or online).

When someone wants to buy an item, they might raise their hand or nod their head to show they are bidding.

An auctioneer (the person in charge) will see this and accept their bid. It

is common for people to get carried away bidding against each other.

When buyers start competing this way, the price is driven up, which is good for the seller.

The item is eventually sold to the highest bidder – the one who is willing to pay the most.

When an item is sold, the auctioneer hammers down on timber using a small wooden mallet called a gavel.
